Hot and Cold. A set of ten short plays, all written by members of Back Alley's writers lab, most of them light, trite entertainments without substance. The audience seemed to get the most fun out of Terry Kingsley-Smith's Meals on Wheels, although Eileen Heckart's presence accounts for the strength of its impact. My personal favorite was Christmas by David Bennett Carren, about a group of writers who are so insensitive that they destroy the confidence of a newcomer—self-help writers labs are often plagued with such vacuous cruelty.
