THE MYTHS by Kenneth Cavander

The Twelve Labours of Hercules...Zeus descending to earth in the shape of a swan and making love to Leda...the Harpies...the infant Apollo strangling the dragon of Delphi... ...these Greek myths were more than pretty tales told for amusement. They were the underpinnings of an entire culture. In the fifth century BC the power centers and loose alliances that had emerged under the title of city-states were dominated by powerful families, strong-arm military leaders, or a ruling elite. A few - Athens is the best known - had a form of participatory democracy grafted on to the old aristocratic family trees. Constantly feuding, united mainly by fear of the looming power of Persia to the east, they shared an intangible legacy - the stories of their ancestral gods and heroes. The myths transcended political boundaries, legitimized the privileges of the landowning and priestly castes, bestowed tribal indentity and character.

Within each state they did even more. The Greeks of this era were, by our standards, illiterate. Writing was a new-fangled device, fit for slaves and bureaucrats; the spoken word was the only reliable token of truth. An educated Greek was brought up on the rote learning of epic and lyric poetry, music, physical development, mathematics. These are not so unrelated as they might seem. Rhythm and music are powerful aids to memory, as the makers of TV commercials well know; combined with gesture and physical movement they are even more effective.

So, in a society without books, education through poetry made sense. The poetry, especially the Homeric epics, drew almost exclusively on the myths, and embedded in the myths were prescriptions for every kind of behaviour, from the correct etiquette for welcoming a guest to elaborate and subtle points of morality. On a deeper, unacknowledged level the myths that captured and held the imagination of the Greeks seem to us, in hindsight, to reveal much about the unspoken fears and obsessions of their collective psyche - fears and obsessions which were acted out, exorcised, 'purged', in the great national spectacles of which the dramatic performances were a part. Moreover, the myths were not consigned to a few ceremonial occasions. They infiltrated the daily life of every Greek citizen. At all the crossroads - a Hermes or a Hecate; on the drinking cups, bowls, and oil vessels - scenes from the stories; at every turning point in life, birth, puberty, marriage, death, on the architecture, during national holidays and rituals, on social occasions - the songs, actions, words and images were there, reminding people of the traditional tales. From birth to death the Greeks were steeped in their legends.

In the course of the fifth century BC an economic and social upheaval changed all this. Itinerant philosophers and intellectuals, artists, ordinary citizens, began to question the myths and subject them to rational scrutiny. Plato, in his handbook for a new society, The Republic, puts in the mouth of Socrates theories about poetry which sound to us philistine and totalitarian. But Plato had a point. If you want to create a revolution in values, if you want to rewrite the history of an entire society, then you must begin with the young, with education. And in the Greece of those days education meant the poets and storytellers. So when Plato has Socrates say that poets must be curbed and censored, he was simply being a practical politician. The poets held the key because it was through their versions of the myths, told and retold in the hypnotic rhythms of sophisticated verse, that young people absorbed the governing values of the day. To change the values you had to seize control of the myths.

All this ferment is reflected even in the pitifully small fraction of Greek drama that has filtered down to us. Throughout the plays we can hear the contradictory voices of a culture at odds with itself. Incarnated in the mythical heroes and heroines, as well as in the gods, are the themes of self-affirmation and celebration, the tensions and self-doubts, of a society in stress, with every tradional relationship between men and the gods, between the individual and the state, between the sexes and the generations - called into question.
