A very unusual production just opened to rave reviews at the BACK ALLEY THEATRE in

VAN NUYS. title: THE EARLY GIRL. The play is about the lives of the girls in a

house of prostitution. And somehow - despite the degradation and white slavery aspect

of the play, there are ___ moments that are almost tender. At first - the action

seems to center around the arrival of a New Cirl...a young, singlemother who wants to

make a bundle ___ in ONE MONTH...retire...and go back to rearing her daughter,

who is - meanwhile - being taken care of by her trusted friend.

But her friendship with Jean, another of the girls in the house, who had ALSO determined to leave and still couldn't work up the moral courage to take off - their friendship becomes the focal point of the show. At one point - when there has been a huge confrontation between Lily - the new girl - and another : who

been around a long time - Jean cautioned Lily: "When feelings manage to go on here, Lily, we respect them...'cause they are precious few."

A most interesting aspect of the Back Alley production is that after the show Thursday evenings, a TALK BACK occurs. Representatives from three local organizations, formed to help those who want to leave the profession... WILL be answering questions from the audience.

the three groups are:

Cartharsis (which operates a 24-hour hotline providing group and private counseling);
The Mary Magdalene Project, a non-denominational residential program here in the Valley which furnishes educational and therapeutic help to these people (among their literature I read a most touching letter from the mother of one of the girls who is now - once more - earning her living legitimately and rearing her own child. The letter was full of deep gratitude for the rescue work they'd done for her daughter).

And the Don Bosco Society counsels the boys who've slipped into such work.
