A Walk on the Wild Side. Will Holt's musical adaptation of the Nelson Algren novel proves problematic. An Innocuous score and surfacelevel characterization weaken Algren's dark, seamy tale of Depression-era desperation. The action centers around Dove, an illiterate boy in pursuit of financial success. An ironic turn of events finds Dove making his fortune as a peepshow stud at a house of prostitution. This treatment delivers some of the novel's poetry, but none of its staying power. Characters lose their complexities for the sake of a simplified story, and Dove's redemption becomes another predictable plot point. (Reviewed by Alison Sloane.)
